DRONE

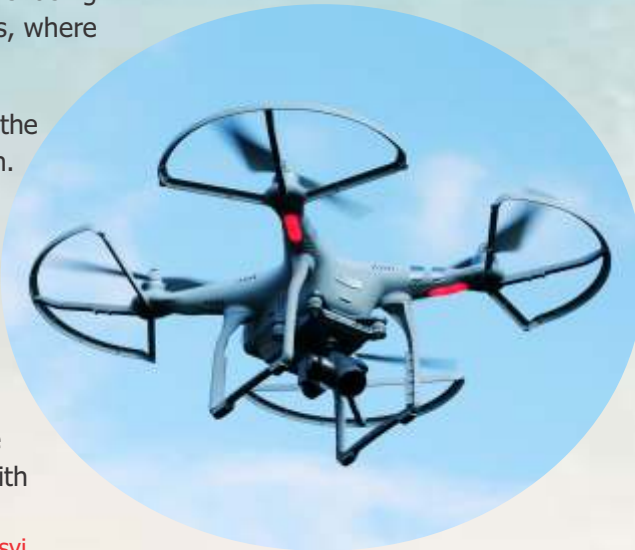
In this era of technology, rapid developments are being made everyday, especially in the field of electronics, where automation of dangerous tasks is the top priority.

The Dam Survey Drone, designed by Aryan B, Deepak K and Thejasvi S was created to identify cracks on any wall to prevent its eventual collapse.

Intensive coding, including complex image processing were some of the few things we learnt during this wonderful experience of making a drone from scratch. Everything was done in the ATL lab with the help of the instructors.

The team consisting of Rayansh K, Shree Aadithyaa and Pranav A has made a prototype of a versatile drone which specializes in keeping the windows of humongous skyscrapers dust free and clean. This project gave us great insight into this branch of aerodynamics and enabled us to perform an in-depth analysis into the working of the drone.

Our drone detects natural gases and LPG. It can be of great help to oil and gas industries for exploration and detection of leakage in pipelines.

These drones can be sent beforehand to coal mines and caves to detect the presence of hydrocarbons and natural gas, the leakage of which can lead to many disasters. Thus, human lives can be saved.

Our drone uses mq4 and mq5 gas sensors which are highly sensitive to hydrocarbons, especially methane and LPG. It uses a bluetooth module to transmit the data to the phone.

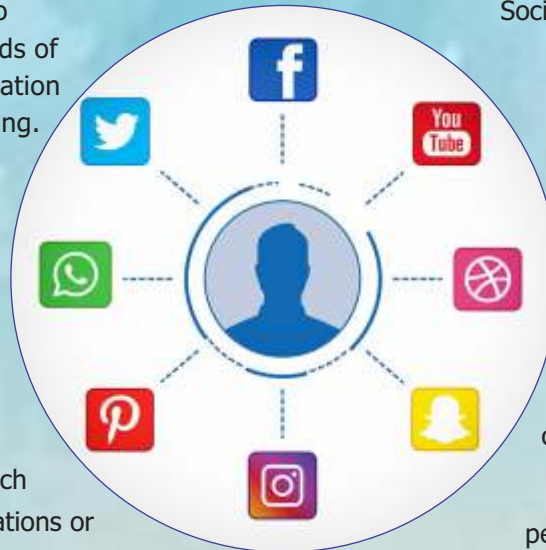
