

NIGHT BLOOMING JASMINE

The night-blooming jasmine (Cestrum nocturnum) is aptly named because

its white-yellow, tubular flowers bloom at night; the flowers close during the day. It belongs to the Solanaceae family, also known as the nightshade or potato family of plants. It is known for its scent and is quite possibly the strongest scented plant in the world. When in bloom, the flowers release a scent of sweet perfume that pervades the area within 300-500ft of the plant. It is a sub-tropical plant that



was first discovered growing in the West Indies and was quite possibly brought to Europe by Christopher Columbus. Cestrum nocturnum is an evergreen woody shrub. The cascading clusters of tiny tubular flowers are cream colored - not particularly showy but they pack a wallop of scent when they open at dusk.
