



Carbon samples from Keeladi had been sent to the Beta Analytic Lab in Miami, Florida, for carbon dating. The scripts found at Keeladi shows a remarkable similarity with the scripts that were found in Indus civilization. The graffiti discovers in Keeladi dates back to 580 BCE and it closely resembles the Indus script. Archaeology department had identified nearly 293 Sangam Age towns along the course of river Vaigai. The Sangam period or age, or the third Sangam period, is a period of history of ancient Tamil Nadu. This is one of the unforgettable discoveries made by the archaeology department and it's a matter of pride for every Indian. It is rightly believed that India is a land of mysteries. Adhithi. A recent excavation has also revealed that the temple had a tank which is approximately 1200 years old. There is a statue of Nandi (holy cow) facing the deity and it is believed that if one says their problem or their wish in the ears of Nandi, the path towards that particular goal gets easier. Thousands of people all around the world visit this temple especially during Mahashivratri. The main reason behind writing an article on this incredible temple is that I live nearby, and I feel really blessed to have a historic place right in my lane. I feel really calm when I sit in the temple. When I take the first spoon of the prasadam given in the temple during festivals, I feel so delighted. This is definitely a must-visit temple when one travels to Bangalore.

- 2. Manyu Mehendale of grade 9 B won the first prize in the Kannada Essay Competition.


SCINTIFIC 2021 IDEATHON

Atharva Aravind of grade 4B secured the 3rd position in the Climate Change art contest conducted by the World Zarathushti Chamber of Commerce (WZCC).












