A Taste Of Italy (With A Twist)

Just like bread and rice, pasta is a staple food. It comes in all sizes and shapes, making it highly versatile and exceptionally multifaceted. The thing about pasta is that it can be remarkably fancy and aesthetic. Here are two exciting pasta recipes for all.

Evening snacks

Crispy pasta Ingredients:

- > water
- > 1 tsp salt
- > 2 tsp oil
- > 2 cup macaroni pasta
- > ¼ cup maida
- > ½ cup cornflour
- > oil (for frying)

Tandoori flavour ingredients:

- > 1 tsp chilli powder
- > ½ tsp cumin powder
- > ½ tsp coriander powder
- > ½ tsp garam masala
- > 1 tsp kasuri methi (crushed)
- > ¼ tsp salt

Chaat flavour Ingredients:

- > 1 tsp chaat masala
- > ¼ tsp pepper powder
- > ¼ tsp salt

Steps for preparation of Crispy Pasta:

First, in a large vessel, take enough water. Add 1 tsp salt, 2 tsp oil and get to boil. Once the water boils, add 2 cups of macaroni pasta, you can use any shape of your choice. Boil for 7 minutes, or check package instructions to know the cooking time. Once the pasta is medium cooked, drain off the water. Rinse with cold water to prevent overcooking the pasta. Transfer the boiled pasta to a large bowl. and add ¼ cup maida and ¼ cup cornflour and mix well. Add more cornflour if required and coat the pasta with flour. Deep fry in hot oil, keeping the flame on low to medium. Keep stirring in between and fry until the pasta turns golden and crispy, take at least 15 minutes to get crispy macaroni (low flame). Drain off over kitchen towel/tissue paper to get rid of excess oil.

Crispy Pasta with Tandoori flavour:

Take fried pasta in a large bowl. add 1 tsp chilli powder, ½ tsp cumin powder, ½ tsp coriander powder, ½ tsp garam masala, 1 tsp kasuri methi and ¼ tsp salt. Mix well making sure all the spices are well coated. Finally, enjoy tandoori flavoured pasta with evening tea.

Crispy Pasta with Chaat flavour:

Take fried pasta in a large bowl. add 1 tsp chaat masala, ¼ tsp pepper powder and ¼ tsp salt. Mix well making sure all the spices are well coated. Finally, enjoy chaat-flavoured pasta with evening tea.

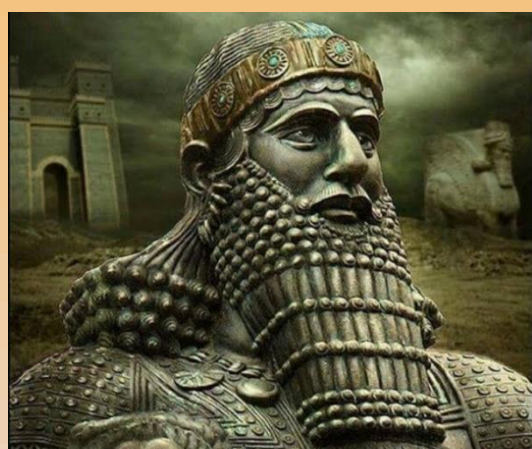

> Take suggestions to achieve success.

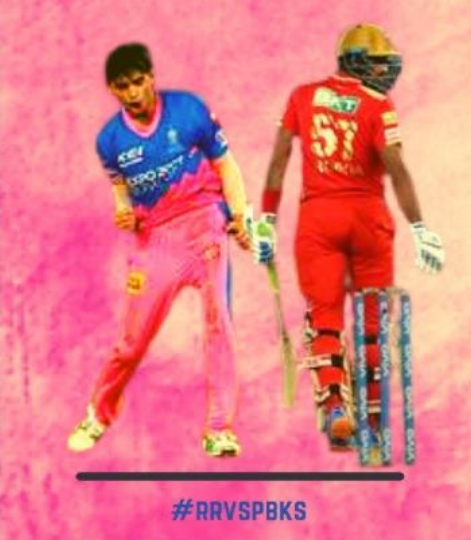

Ben Simmons: Trust in the Process or Build Towards Progress?



The Philadelphia 76ers, after struggling for the better part of the early 2010s, with a subpar roster with little to no trade assets, had no option but to tank, and "Trust the Process", hoping that eventually the draft lottery would land them young talent in the draft. This dream became a reality, as they landed Markelle Fultz, one of the most hyped up prospects at the time, Joel Embiid, a player who has proved to be an MVP caliber center, and Ben Simmons, who won the Rookie of the Year in the 2017-2018, after missing the 2016-2017 season due to a foot injury.

Flash forward to the 2021 season, Joel Embiid still continues to produce at a monumental rate, averaging 28.5 points, 10.6 rebounds, 2.8 assists and an impressive 37% from behind the arc on 3 attempts a game, as well as being a defensive anchor for the team. A rift however, has arisen in the team, as Ben Simmons hasn't produced nearly well enough, considering the expectations on him.

He averaged only 14.3 points, 6.9 assists and 7.2 boards,

a decline in every stat category. The 76ers, who expected him to play as their starting point guard, faced the brunt of his lacklustre production, chokin an 18 point lead in game 4 against the hawks, and a 22 point lead in the 5th game of the same playoff series in the conference semifinals of the 2020-21 season, in which Ben Simmons averaged only 9.9 points, 6.3 boards, 8.6 assist, with an abhorrent free throw percentage of 33%. He also infamously passed up an open dunk in game 7 of the same series, which would've tied the game with only 3 minutes left to play.

Ben Simmons' performance this year has been extremely mixed to say the least, and people have been calling him an "exaggerated roleplayer" and one of the most overrated players in the league. As he is still young, people have been excusing his poor shooting and game sense, but he repeatedly refuses to work on these aspects of his game, and as he keeps becoming older, these questions will only become more justified unless he improves his poor work ethic, something which most people believe is impossible. The 76ers are now given two options; 1: To trade Ben, who is still a very valuable trade asset due to his size and young age, keeping their other, more consistent star Joel Embiid, or 2: Persisting to follow the Process, and trying their best to fulfil Ben Simmons true potential. Only time can tell us what will happen, so make sure to stay tuned.
