ARE WE HEALTHY?

A recent report by WHO-UNICEF-Lancet states, "Children's exposure to commercial marketing of junk food and sugary beverages is associated with the purchase of unhealthy foods leading to the alarming rise in childhood comorbidities. The index of healthcare-related comorbidity has increased from 11 million in 1975 to 124 million in 2016 - a 11-fold increase"

A Sattvic diet enables these eight characters to blossom. Our ancient scriptures which are manuals for leading a happy and content life offer great remedies. According to Bhagavad-Gita 17.8, Sattvic diet is light in nature, easily digestible, slightly cooling and not disturbing to the mind. Being rich in Prana (purity), it promotes longevity, strength, positive thoughts, happiness and satisfaction. These foods are sweet, juicy, fattening and palatable.

RANI LAKSHMI BAI: THE WARRIOR QUEEN OF JHANSI

I went to visit my grandparents at Gwalior during the summer holidays. Gwalior is located in Madhya Pradesh. It is full of historical buildings and monuments. There are many tourist attractions in Gwalior like the Gwalior Fort or the Jai Vilas palace, but this time, I got a chance to visit Rani Lakshmi Bai's Samadhi. The samadhi (a resting place for the ashes) is situated on the foothills of the Gwalior fort in an area called Phool Bagh.

Rani Lakshmi Bai was the queen of Jhansi. She was a brave and fearless woman. She fought against the British in the Indian Rebellion of 1857. Rani Lakshmi Bai was born in a Maratha family at Varanasi in 1828. As a child, along with reading and



writing, she also received training in horse riding, shooting a gun, self-defence and archery. Before marriage, her name was Manikarnika. After marriage, she became the Rani of Jhansi – Lakshmi Bai. She adopted a child named Damoder Rao.

After the death of her husband, the British government refused to allow her adopted son to become the Raja and Jhansi was then ruled by the British. Rani Lakshmi Bai's appeal to the British government was rejected. She was asked to leave her palace and fort of Jhansi. After being expelled from her palace, Lakshmi Bai did not want to give the town of Jhansi to the Britishers. She gave military training to both men and women of Jhansi for the defence of the city.

The British attacked Jhansi to take the city from Rani. Rani Lakshmi Bai wanted independence and announced that "Mein apni Jhansi kabhi nahin doongi"! (I will never give my Jhansi!). The British army was able to conquer Jhansi only after a lot of resistance and heavy fighting. Many people of the city were killed in the fight. Rani Lakshmi Bai escaped to Kalpi with her son and with the help of the Maratha general Tantya Tope. Jointly, they defeated the army of the Maharaja of Gwalior and later occupied the Gwalior Fort.

The Britishers thought that Rani was the "the most dangerous of all the rebel leaders." When the British army surrounded the Gwalior fort on June 17, 1858, Rani Lakshmi Bai escaped from the fort dressed as a soldier. She rode a horse, with her son tied to her back and began attacking the British troops. Lakshmi Bai fiercely fought the British army near the Phool Bagh area of Gwalior. When she got severely wounded in battle, she asked a hermit to cremate her body after death so that the British could not capture it. Her body was cremated by the local people as per her wishes. It is said that Lakshmi Bai's remains were buried under a tamarind tree.

The Samadhi of Rani Lakshmi Bai was built at the place where the great warrior queen laid down her life. An 8-meter tall metal statue of Rani Lakshmi Bai is present at the Samadhi. Legend has it that the statue of Rani Lakshmi Bai at the Samadhi also included a child riding behind her on the horse but the statue of the child disappeared or was stolen many years ago. A fair is organized at the Samadhi every year in June to honour the queen. The whole Samadhi complex is very peaceful. There is a lot of greenery, with tamarind and mango trees. Hundreds of parrots live among the trees. It gave me goose bumps to remember that hundreds of years ago at this place an important battle for Indian independence was fought.

A famous poem called, "Khoob Ladi Mardani, Woh toh Jhansi Wali Rani Thi" was written by the Hindi poetess Subhadra Kumari Chauhan, about the bravery of Rani Lakshmi Bai. Children all over India learn it in school and remember the brave queen of Jhansi who was one of the important leaders of the First War of Indian Independence. Rani Lakshmibai, who died on June 18, 1858, continues to inspire us with her fearlessness and determination. Aarav Pashilkar, V E
